Content	<p>Literature as art: Works of literature communicate through their artistic form.</p> <p>Students will be expected to learn some of the fundamental characteristics of literary form. The particular artistic elements to be studied will depend on the works selected by the instructor, but all students will be expected to both recognize and analyze the function of key forms and structures used in fiction, poetry, and drama.</p> <p>Literature and culture: Every work of literature is the product of a culture with a specific history. How is that important to our understanding of a work? How do the cultural assumptions and expectations of the author shape the work that we read? How do the cultural assumptions and expectations of the reader shape his or her interpretation of that work? Also, is it possible for literary works to transcend culture and speak to universal human concerns?</p>
